

VILLAGE OF EAGLE CODES & ORDINANCES COMMITTEE MEETING  
“UNAPPROVED” MINUTES – FEBRUARY 16, 2009

Chair Rice called the February meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. and confirmed Open Meeting Law requirements. Roll was taken: French, Ehlers, Scheff, Thomas, Rice – present. No citizens present.

There were no citizen comments.

Chief Ehlers discussed reasons for requesting action on a no parking, standing, or stopping resolution on streets adjacent to the Eagle Elementary School Monday through Friday between the hours of 2:30 p.m. and 3:30 p.m. Chief Ehlers explained that the school has a designated parking area for parents to pick up children from school. Instead of parking in the designated area, he has received complaints that parents park their cars along Andrew Street and East Street waiting to pick up their kids from school. This causes congestion in the area, poor traffic flow, creates a problem for adjacent homeowners trying to enter and exit their driveways, concern for the safety of kids walking home along that route.

The committee discussed a resolution for parking restrictions along the residential streets near Eagle Elementary School Monday through Friday from between the hours of 2:30 p.m. and 3:30 p.m. A motion was made by Chief Ehlers to approve the resolution as written and present to the full Board of Trustees at the next Village Board meeting on Thursday March 12, 2008. The motion was seconded by Thomas and unanimously approved by the committee.

Agenda item 5 followed with discussion on Chapter 15 Orderly Conduct. Chief Ehlers brought up the issue of drinking at Kettle Moraine Days. Our current Code Section 15.3(7b) makes it illegal to consume intoxicating liquor or fermented malt beverages on any public street, alley, sidewalk, or public property of the Village except parks. Discussion followed regarding adding an exception clause which would include Kettle Moraine Days for fermented malt beverages only since State statutes prohibit persons leaving a licensed establishment with open intoxicating liquor.

The committee discussed the Burning Resolution passed in 2005, and what we need to add it to Section 15.01(4). The committee agreed to check with Fire Department Chief Heim for his opinion on the Resolution and whether fines were in place for open fires that get out of control and require Fire Department assistance.

The committee agreed that Section 15.01(2) & (3) should be changed to make it illegal to shoot a bow within Village limits. We will continue our review of Chapter 15, with the intent of updating the entire chapter for review by the Village Board in the near future. Mike Rice will update Chapter 15 per committee suggestions and present to the committee as a draft for reference at our next meeting.

There was a brief discussion on Bail Bond Schedule, Chapter 16 and it was decided to address those issues at our next committee meeting.

Motion was made by Scheff to adjourn and seconded by French. Meeting adjourned at 8:00 p.m.
